



Pool Party Rental Information

The Stonebrook Club (SBC) welcomes all members in good standing the option of renting the swimming Pool for social engagements. The SBC Pool Rental Agreement must be completed and payment received in order to reserve the pool. Please note all reservations must be made at least 14 days in advance of the event. The pool cannot be rented on holidays.

Pool rentals are available Friday and Saturday evenings, from 6:30-8:30PM for private gatherings. Cost is \$250 and is limited to 40 swimmers. For an additional \$50.00, we welcome an additional 10 people.

All applications must be processed through the Business Office located within the club house. Only the Business Manager or Pool Manger can approve rentals.

Cancellations

Pool rentals are eligible for a full refund provided the reservation is canceled at least 14 days ahead of the scheduled rental date. Refunds will not be issued due to weather. See below for the inclement weather exception:

Weather Cancellations:

The SBC reserves the right to close any facility or cancel rentals if inclement weather is imminent. The SBC will make every effort to contact users in a timely manner by telephone and/or email. All efforts will be made to keep approved facility reservations intact; however, SBC reserves the right to cancel a function if necessary. A full refund will be issued if the SBC cancels the reservation prior to the reservation start time.

If the applicant wants to cancel their reservation due to an impending storm, the applicant must call the Club at (540) 662-7564 and speak with a manager no later than 6:00 p.m. An option for a full refund or reschedule will be available to the applicant prior to 6:00 p.m. If the applicant calls after 6:00 p.m., no refund will be issued.

If the applicant wants to proceed with their reservation, or does not call before 6:00 p.m., SBC staff reserves the right, per Closing Policy (attached) to clear the facility, whether it be temporarily or permanently, for the safety of patrons and staff. If SBC staff clear the pool during the rental, no refund will be issued.

POOL RULES & POLICIES

Lifeguards are on duty to help prevent accidents and provide a safe atmosphere for our members and their guests. Please respect their judgment when they are enforcing rules, regulations and policies.

General Rules:

- All individuals must be members in good standing or a guest of said member and must be accompanied by said member at all times.
- Children 12 years of age and under must be accompanied and supervised by an adult 18 years of age or older at all times. Children 13 years of age and up may enter without an adult.
- Diapers are not permitted in the pool. Swim diapers or plastic diaper covers MUST be worn at all times, if needed.
- Swimmers are permitted to wear bathing suits, shorts and t-shirts. Cut-offs, undergarments, and street clothes are not acceptable swim attire.
- No running, rough play, or fighting on the deck or in the pool. Dunking, riding shoulders, throwing others, and diving off others is not permitted.
- Abusive or profane language will not be permitted or tolerated in any area of the pool facility.
- Swimmers must stay off lane ropes and lifeguard stands.
- No inflatable flotation devices, fins, or snorkels are allowed in the main pool; approved life jackets are permitted.
- Deep end is for diving board use only.
- No diving in areas that are less than 5 feet deep.
- Lap swimmers must stay within the lane lines at all times; free swim is NOT allowed in this area.
- During designated Adult Swim times, all patrons under the age of 18 years must leave the water; ages 2 years and under are allowed when accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- No food or drinks are allowed in the pool or on the pool deck. They are only permitted at the pavilion, concession seating area, under the shade structure/deck and in the grassy area. NO glass containers of any kind are permitted in the pool area.
- No pets are allowed within the pool area; exceptions will be made for service animals with prior management approval.
- Pool Managers may eject and suspend persons from the pool area for violation of pool rules, not following lifeguard instructions, harassment of lifeguards or other pool staff, or any other action detrimental to the safe and orderly operation of the pool. In cases involving children, parents will be notified.
- If a child unaccompanied by an adult is asked to leave the pool area, they will not be permitted to reenter any facility at the club until management has spoken with a parent or guardian.

Deep End/Diving Area Rules:

- Deep end is for diving only; diving from the sides is only permitted if the diving board is not occupied.
- Only one person on the diving board at a time; do not dive until the person in front of you reaches the ladder.
- Only one bounce on the board. No running, cartwheels, handstands, no inward dives. All divers must jump straight off the board
- All persons must use the ladder to mount the board; alternate board use.
- No catching others jumping off the board
- No personal flotation devices, goggles, masks, or glasses are allowed when entering the water from the diving board.

POOL RULES & POLICIES CONT.

Baby Pool Area Rules:

- Children 9 years of age and over are NOT permitted in the water; no exceptions
- All children must be directly supervised by an adult, supervising adults may enter the water
- No running or horseplay on the deck.
- Only individuals accompanying children are permitted in the baby pool area.

Closing Policy:

- Stonebrook Management reserves the right to determine safety conditions of the swimming pool use by members before, during, and after inclement weather and/or emergency situations.
- Hours of operation and special services subject to cancellation due to emergency or weather conditions include: morning or evening swim team practice, private pool parties, and general swim.
- If inclement weather occurs prior to the opening of the pool and cancellation or delayed opening becomes necessary, it will be posted on the Club Automation Member announcement page, the Club Automation Member email service (if time permits) and via Facebook. If the pool has already opened for the day, announcements will be made at the facility, posted on the Club Automation Member announcement page, the Club Automation Member email service (if time permits) and via Facebook.
- Conditions for NOT opening the pool include but are not limited to:
 - Pouring rain
 - Weather conditions deemed to be hazardous
 - Temperatures are in the low 60's
 - Emergency situations include but are not limited to: hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, and/or bomb threats
 - Pool equipment breakdowns
- Conditions that may delay the opening of the pool
 - Current weather conditions are unfavorable
 - Knowledge of anticipated inclement, dangerous, or threatening weather.
- If the pool opens, it will remain open, unless weather conditions deem it necessary to close. Conditions for closing early include but are not limited to:
 - Pouring rain
 - Weather conditions are deemed to be hazardous
 - Temperatures are in the low 60's
 - Emergency situations include but are not limited to; hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, bomb threats
 - Pool equipment breakdowns
- Management also reserves the right to close the pool early if patronage is nonexistent after two (2) hours of opening or with less than one (1) hour left during normal operating hours.

Inclement Weather Policy

If the pool must go on stand-by, due to inclement weather, all members, guests and staff must clear the pool area, including the deck and grassy areas and seek shelter in a covered area (shelter, bathrooms, concession seating or vehicles). Unattended children shall be taken into the club lounge, if club is still open and supervised by staff. If the club is closed, children must remain in the concession seating area and supervised by staff.

Conditions that can cause stand-by:

- Rain that limits visualization of swimmers and the pool bottom; pool will re-open once the rain has stopped
- Thunder is heard and/or lighting is seen. Area will be clear for 20 minutes from confirmation of thunder and/or lighting, a new 20 minute starts each time thunder is heard or lighting is seen (see thunderstorm and lighting activity below).
- If any condition limits the members in attendance, the manager on duty will only retain personnel necessary for safe operation.
- If the pool cannot open within the hour of stand-by, then the pool shall close.

Thunderstorm and Lighting Activity

- Remember the safety rule: When the thunder roars, go indoors! Always pay attention to weather reports. During a thunderstorm, stay away from windows and glass doors in case they break.
- Lightning can come in through the plumbing, so don't do things that need running water. If you can't get inside, stay away from trees and power lines, and make sure you aren't the tallest object in the area. If you are in a car, stay there and don't touch anything metal.
- If you are in the water when a thunderstorm happens, get out immediately and go indoors for safety.

When lightning is seen, begin counting seconds. Continue to count until you hear the thunder. Light travels approximately 186,000 miles per second. Sound travels about 1,200 feet per second. Divide the number of seconds between the lightening and the thunder by 5 to estimate the distance to the storm in miles. For example:

- Lighting is seen.
- Begin counting—one thousand one, one thousand two, etc.
- Thunder is heard.
- Stop counting. Six seconds have been counted.
- Divide by 5 to determine the distance in miles. The storm is approximately 1.2 miles away.



Pool Flotation Device Policy

Approved Flotation Devices Only:

Only U.S. Coast Guard-approved personal flotation devices (PFDs) are permitted, these include:

- Type I, II, or III life jackets
- U.S. Coast Guard-labeled vests designed for recreational swimming



Prohibited Items Include (but are not limited to):

- Water wings ("arm floaties")
- Inflatable rafts, tubes, or loungers
- Noodles used as flotation
- Kick-boards used for floating or play
- Baby flotation seats/rings without Coast Guard approval

Reasons for This Policy:

- Non-approved flotation devices can give a false sense of security.
- These devices are not designed to keep swimmers' airways above water in emergencies.
- Many inflatable items can deflate or tip easily, increasing the risk of drowning.

Exceptions:

- U.S. Coast Guard-approved devices used under direct adult supervision.
- Devices used in swim lessons or aquatic therapy, when approved by pool staff.

Enforcement:

All swimmers and guests are expected to comply with this policy. Lifeguards and facility staff have the authority to remove any non-approved flotation devices from the pool area.
